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Dear friends in Christ,

Grace and peace to you at the Advent of this new church year!

Advent, traditionally, is a time of waiting and preparation for the coming of our Lord. We decorate our sanctuaries, hear John the Baptist preach in the wilderness, and seek to "prepare him room" as we balance all the demands of this holiday season. Church tradition tells us to wait to proclaim the joy of the season until the arrival of the Christ Child on Christmas Eve, but this year at St. John's, I'm not sure we can keep this joy contained!

Starting Christ the King Sunday (November 26), our congregation has entered what I lovingly call "Baptism-palooza." Between the end of November and the middle of January, we will celebrate the baptism of eight children and youth in our congregation! The soon-to-be-baptized are various ages, ranging from six weeks-old to sixteen years-old. As their pastor, I give thanks that the Holy Spirit is working so significantly in their lives—calling them to the font and preparing their hearts to follow the way of Jesus.

Anytime a child of God is baptized and is welcomed into the body of Christ, we're invited to join the angel chorus in singing its Alleluias. And this imagery of the angels singing with joy draws my mind to the angel chorus that appears to the shepherds announcing Jesus' birth. "Glory to God in the highest heaven," they proclaim, "and on earth peace among those whom he favors!" (Luke 2:14).

Though Advent is traditionally a time of waiting, it doesn't have to be without joy. We can sing with the angels and praise God for what has been given to us in the birth of Jesus—the life of our Messiah and the promise of resurrection, which we receive in baptism. AND in the midst of this joy, we can wonder together, as Christ's body, where the Holy Spirit is at work here in the present day.

We await many things in life—peace, justice, and restoration to name a few. And as we wait for the day of the Lord to finally arrive, the day when the mountains will be made low and the valleys lifted up, the day when the glory of the Lord is fully revealed, we can walk along the path that Jesus has prepared for us. We can draw on our own baptismal promises for inspiration of how to reflect God's love and grace during this time of waiting—promises to share the Gospel, to serve our neighbors, and to work for justice and peace in all the earth.

As the body of Christ grows during the Advent and Christmas seasons, may we experience the joy of our Lord, singing with the angels and entering into the hope and promise of our coming Messiah. All glory be to God—Alleluia!



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#### **EPIPHANY**



The Christmas of the Gentiles or Little Christmas is the twelfth day of the Christmas Season. It marks the visit of the Magi or Wise Men to the infant Jesus. It is often called the season of light, since

the Magi followed the star to the manger in Bethlehem. The Day of Epiphany was once second in importance only to Easter. It is now celebrated on January 6.

The song, "The Twelve Days of Christmas," is meant to take place during the twelve days between Christmas and Epiphany. In some cultures, gifts are exchanged on this day in remembrance of the gifts brought by the Magi to Jesus. The season of Epiphany runs from January 6 until Ash Wednesday (February 14, 2024), the beginning of Lent.

o *PA Dutch Corn Pie* – Nine-inch ready-to-bake frozen PA Dutch corn pie made with potatoes, fresh and frozen corn, hard-boiled eggs, diced celery, black pepper, and milk. Put into a double crust, then frozen.

o *Italian Hoagies* – Start with a nine-inch hoagie roll. Add sliced provolone cheese, sliced boiled ham, sliced hard salami, sliced deli pepperoni, shredded lettuce, oregano, and the following items each in a separate bag: sliced onions, sliced tomatoes, and sliced banana peppers with packets of mayonnaise and Italian dressing.

o *Broccoli Cheddar Cheese Soup* – A blend of diced onions sauteed in butter along with broccoli. Thicken with flour. Blend in a good hearty chicken stock, whole milk, and shredded cheddar cheese. Season with black pepper, parsley, and Worcestershire sauce.

- o *Chicken Tortellini Soup* A blend of diced celery, diced onions, diced tomatoes, shredded carrots, chunks of tender chicken, cut sweet corn, green beans, cauliflower, and broccoli sauteed in butter. Add black pepper, tomato sauce, and cheese tortellini. Price \$7.50 per quart.
- o *Minestrone Soup* A blend of diced celery, diced onions, and sliced zucchini sauteed in butter. Blend in chicken, beef, and vegetable broth. Add red-skin potatoes, elbow macaroni, tomatoes, red kidney & white beans, and cut green beans. Season with black pepper and parsley.

Price - \$7.50 per quart.


