Dear friends in Christ,

Autumn blessings to you from Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord!

Recently, I've been reflecting upon autumn as a season of transition and preparation, which is made evident by the world around us. The trees change colors and drop their leaves, the daylight grows dim, the air grows cool, and animals burrow away food for the long winter months. Our natural world is preparing for the bareness of winter, a time of hibernation and rest.

One perspective is to look at this season as a time of death and decay as summer's bounty has faded. Yet another, more lifegiving perspective is to notice the ways in which creation prepares for the new life of spring. Yes, we must pass through the dark of winter, but we know that new life awaits us on the other side, just as resurrection awaits us on the other side of the tomb.

Like our physical world, much has changed in our communities, near and far. Locally, nationally, and globally, we live in a much different world than we did even five years ago. And as a result, Christ's Church is different too. Ministry initiatives that were popular fifty years ago are not as popular today. Preferred worship practices from forty years ago are now considered outdated. "The way things were" are in flux as the Church adapts to the new reality outside of our doors.

These life cycles of the Church are just as natural as the seasons, yet these times of transition can leave us wondering how God is calling us to "be" Church today.

Therefore, it's in light of this question that we turn to creation for wisdom.

ISSUE 10/11

Autumn invites us into a time of preparation, a time of planting with the hope of regrowth and new life. We, as Christ's Church, can model ourselves after the wisdom of nature and prepare, too, for new life to emerge. For example, many of us plant flower bulbs in fall, and then, after the cold winter months, tulips and daffodils burst forth as the first signs of spring. Therefore, just as we till the soil of our gardens, we can till the proverbial soil of our church as we prepare for and pray for new life to emerge.

This leads me to wonder: Where do *you* see God calling us? Where do *you* feel the Holy Spirit working in our community, planting seeds of new ideas and new life? What are some ways we can reach out to our ever-changing world to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ?

Autumn is a beautiful time of year as our world transitions around us. Vibrant greens turn to fiery golds, reds, and oranges as God reminds us that transformation and change doesn't have to be scary, transformation and change doesn't have to be "ugly." Let us experience the beauty of transformation here in our faith community as we work together to plant seeds of new life, seeds that will surely take root and bloom all by the grace of God.



REFORMATION DAY

ALL SAINTS SUNDAY




On All Saints Sunday, November 5, we will be remembering in our prayers those who have died in the past year, as well as others that you would like remembered.

The Northern Lehigh Food Bank was formed in 1987 to help families in our community who need assistance in feeding their family. The need to feed local

families is still great in the Northern Lehigh area.

Each church has been given one item for the Thanksgiving and Christmas meal baskets. Our church's responsibility is 200 bags/boxes of instant potatoes for each holiday. *Donations for the Thanksgiving baskets are needed at church by Thursday, November 9* (basket distribution is Saturday, November 11). *Donations for the Christmas baskets are needed at church by Thursday, December 7* (basket distribution will be on Saturday, December 9). There are about 200 food bank families who will receive meals for Thanksgiving and for Christmas.

We will be collecting the boxes/bags of instant potatoes here at St. John's until the due dates, because there is no room at the food bank to store the holiday foods.

If you wish to donate a turkey or a ham, your donation is welcome, but you need to hold it at your home until closer to Thanksgiving and/ or Christmas or call the Northern Lehigh Food Bank at 610-767-9525 to get it there.

The Northern Lehigh Food Bank is currently in need of the following foods: canned fruit, canned soup, canned vegetables, spaghetti sauce, spam, and tuna. Food donations can be placed in the basket in the narthex. The food donations are delivered to the food bank.


